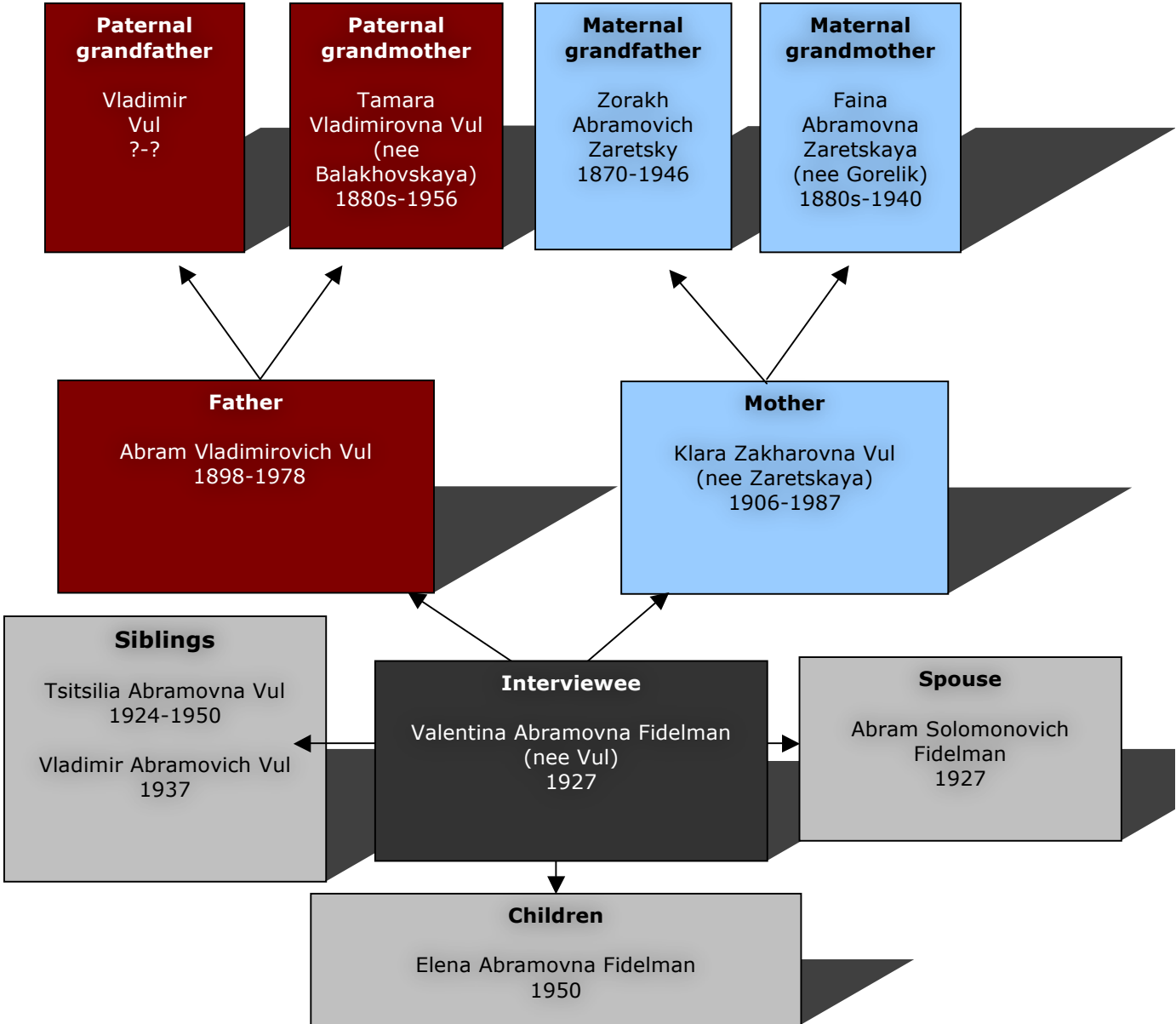

What sort of work do/did you do?

1945-1946: medical nurse in medical unit of Plant № 278 (a secret plant producing military aircrafts), Leningrad

1954-1955: pediatrics doctor, hospital in Bakhchisarai region (today Ukraine)

1955-1961: pediatrics doctor, Petroslavvansky Hospital, Leningrad

1959-?: people's deputy of Kolpinsky district, Leningrad

1961-1961: medical doctor, boarding school №20 of Moskovsky district, Leningrad

1961-1962: pediatrics doctor, Petroslavvansky Hospital, Leningrad

1963-1984: children psychiatrist, psycho-neurological department, Kolpino district, Leningrad (today St. Petersburg)

Army service: Which army and what years?

1914-1917: medical assistant in the active army

1941-1946: irregular army near Luga

Tell me about his brothers and sisters. (name, date of birth and death, occupation, place of residence, family, etc.)

They lived in different places: Sonya in Siberia, Vera in Moscow, Ruvim in Leningrad, Isaak in Vladikavkaz.

Sonya, Vera, Isaak are buried at Jewish cemeteries, Ruvim – in a common grave, there is no information about two other sisters.

Maryasya: 1907-1967, finished cheder, obtained the specialty of a librarian, worked in a library

1920s-1943: Leningrad

1943-1944 in evacuation, the town of Orenburg, worked as a bread cutter

1946-1967: Leningrad

Avraam: 1908-1970s

Konstantin: 1909-1960s, sailor, children Yalya and Felix

Tasya: 1911-1990, finished cheder, then completed a course of accountancy and worked as a booking office cashier at the Moscow Railway Station in Leningrad

Fima: 1915-1953: worked in the Kirov plant

Asya: 1916-1960s, finished cheder, completed three years of Leningrad Humanitarian Institute, Faculty of Foreign Languages

Brother: died in early childhood, 1917-1918
